

Aviation Security Policy (1/2)

Risk-based approach to aviation security

- Promoting understanding of existing and emerging threats (e.g. chemicals)
- New guidance aimed on sharing risk information, managing protests at airports or behavioral detection and insider threat
- New training course on risk management
- Creating Threat Response Group

Harmonising aviation security measures on a pan-European basis

- Consistency between ECAC Doc 30, Part II and EU/EC Regulations and ICAO Annex 17 by adopting amendments to ECAC Doc 30, Part II
- New Doc 30 Annexes, update of existing ones
- New edition of ECAC Aviation Security Handbook



Aviation Security Policy (2/2)

Development and use of security technology and equipment

- New performance standards and common testing methodologies for security equipment
- Reorganisation of technology workstreams





ECAC Common Evaluation Process of Security Equipment (CEP) main updates

- Test results communicated to ECAC MSs and European Commission for the EU stamp purposes, and list available on website for international community
- As from 2024 CEP Management Group open to all ECAC Member States as Supporting Authorities or Observers.
- Cooperation with international partners
- Development and maintenance of Common CTMs is transferred from TTF to new CTM Sub-Group
- Implementation of CEP Roadmap 2022-2024 (reliability, sustainability, transparency)
 - To increase capacities of CEP Participating Test Centres, number of CEP Participating Test Centres, and to implement new testing approaches
- Preparation of CEP Roadmap 2025-2027



ECAC CEP (2/2)

CEP Achievements 2022-2024

- 141 CEP tests allocated (77/141 completed)/135 new equipment configurations meet an ECAC/EU standard.
- CEP testing expanded to APIDS, and EVD
- CEP documents:
 - Test Centre Quality Plan Guidance Document
 - Major update of the CEP Handbook by end of 2024
- CEP awareness training delivered to 21 Member States.
- More than 150 enquiries by MSs and non-ECAC States related to CEP addressed by Secretariat
- Engagement with equipment manufacturers information sessions



ECAC Audit Programme

Resumption of ECAC Aviation Security Audit Programme

- Resumption of security audits after the COVID-19 pandemic in December 2022:
 - Five audits organised since the resumption of the Programme
 - Amendments to the Audit Methodology
 - Recertification of ECAC auditors
- Training and certification of new ECAC auditors on 12-18 June 2024
- Expanding the Programme new cyber security audits to be organised in 2025



ECAC Capacity Building Programme

Supporting MS in maintaining effective aviation security in the face of current changes and challenges within the aviation industry

- Analysis of MS needs in capacity-building
- Nineteen training courses delivered in person and twenty online
- Workshop on Recruitment, Training and Certification of Screeners in Post-Pandemic Environment organised on 18-19 April 2023
- Workshop on Human Factors and Motivation in aviation security to be organised on 13-14 November 2024
- Two new courses developed and four existing courses updated
- For the first time, a training course organised for European Commission aviation security inspectors





CASE II Project


Overview

Funded by EU and implemented by ECAC

- To enhance aviation security capacity in Africa, Middle East, and Asia
- Now extended until November 2025
- Online + in-country training, capacity building activities, mainly conducted by experts from Project Team, ECAC Member States and Partner States
- Two Partner State secondees to Project Team
- Expansion of activities to new training topics in 2023 and 2024
- Beneficiary States: 80
 - Africa 53
 - Asia 10
 - Middle East 12
 - ECAC 5



CASE II Project - achievements




3327 participants (original target 2500)



68% rate of re-engagement

Of 53 Partner States that have engaged in in-country training activities, 36 have benefitted from more than one.
